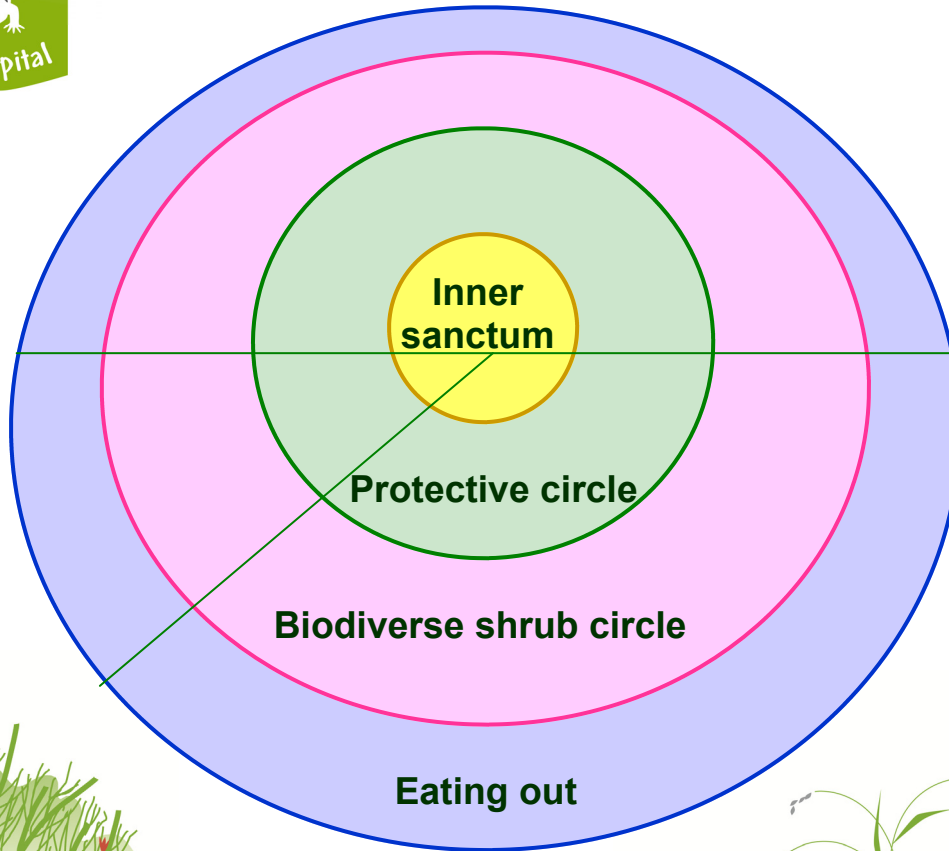




Creating a small bird habitat haven

Your habitat haven may be as big or small as your garden will allow. It may be a pie-shaped wedge in a corner or long and narrow or just the protective spiky circle.



Inner sanctum

Taller, softer shrubs 1-2 meters in height.

Examples: *Pomaderris*, native *Grevillea*, *Ozothamnus* (Paper daisy), *Leptospermum* (Tea-trees), *Acacia linifolia*, *Correa*, *Cassinia*, *Polyscias*.

Vine examples: *Clematis*, *Hardenbergia*, *Eustrephus*, *Smilax*.

Protective circle

Spiky, protective shrubs 1-2 meters high, planted 20 - 25 cm apart.

Examples: *Hakea*, *Acacia ulicifolia*, *Bursaria*, *Banksia*, *Lambertia*, *Woolfsia*, *Styphelia*, *Epacris*, *Daviesia*, *Dillwynia*, *Acacia brownei*.

Biodiverse shrub circle

A variety of small, attractive shrubs.

Examples: *Dianella*, native *Geranium*, *Indigofera*, *Prostanthera*, *Hibbertia* (Guinea flowers), *Zieria*, *Bauera*, *Einadia*, *Helichrysum* (Everlastings), *Leucopogon*, *Gompholobium*, *Billardiera* (vine), *Glycine* (vine).

Eating out

Mixed native grasses and ground covers.

Examples: *Pratia*, native Violet, native *Geranium*, *Microlaena*, *Themeda australis* (Kangaroo Grass), *Centella*, *Dichondra*, *Comelina*, *Hardenbergia violacea* (vine), *Actinotis* (Flannel Flower), *Goodenia*, *Scaevola*, *Wahlenbergia*.
