<i>Hakea teretifolia</i>	white	Summer – Autumn	moist	most
<i>Lambertia formosa</i>	red	Spring – Autumn	drier/shady	sandy
<i>Laxmannia gracilis</i>	pink	Spring	well drained	most
<i>Lagenifera stipitata</i>	mauve	Spring – Summer	moist	most
<i>Lomandra multiflora</i>	cream	Spring	well drained	sandy
<i>Olearia microphylla</i>	yellow	Spring	well drained	sandy
<i>Platylobium formosum</i>	yellow with red	Spring	shady	sandy
<i>Pratia purpurascens</i>	white	Spring – Summer	moist	most
<i>Veronica plebeia</i>	purple/blue	Autumn	moist	most
<i>Viola hederacea</i>	white with purple	Spring	moist/shady	most
